Transition & Aftercare Support Services (TASS)

Transition & Aftercare Support Services provides support for youth transitioning back into the community from the Hawai'i Youth Correctional Facility and their families.

Services are based on an intensive, individualized, and strengths-based approach that focuses on the youth and family's needs and goals. Each family is assigned a Community Advocate who helps them identify and cultivate community relationships and form a network to provide support. Families receive an average of 6 hours of advocacy services each week.

Some youth and families may also participate in our wraparound services, which are provided by a facilitator, navigator and parent partner.

Population and Eligibility Criteria

- Youth ages 12 through 18 (20 if youth is on parole)
- Transitioning out of the Hawai'i Youth Correctional Facility

Youth and Family Responsibilities:

- Participate in the development of an individualized service plan and personal goals
- Participate in program activities, at a specific number of hours per week
- Attend school or maintain another appropriate educational of vocational plan

- Individual and group support
- Advocacy and referrals
- Comprehensive assessments
- Individualized service plan development
- Competency development for youth and parents
- Youth and family support
- Resources development
- In-school assistance
- Connections and collaboration with other


