Kauhale 'Ōpio (KAU)

As part of Hale Kipa's Transitional Living Program, Kauhale 'Ōpio on O'ahu provides residential services to young adults ages 18 through 24 experiencing being unsheltered to promote their successful transition to self-sufficiency.

Kauhale 'Ōpio Residences:

- Our **Men's Residence** houses ten men at a time, ages 18 through 24.
- Our **Women's Residence** houses six women at a time, ages 18 through 24.

In the program, young adults work toward educational and vocational goals and learn life skills as they transition out of being unsheltered. It is our commitment to honor their strengths and support them in realizing their goals while providing appropriate structure and support.

Population and Eligibility Criteria

- Young adults ages 18 through 24
- Homeless or at imminent risk of becoming unsheltered
- Must be employed or attending school
- Willing to participate in program

Young Adult Responsibilities

- Desire to make changes
- Follow household rules
- Maintain employment / schooling

Services

- Goal Planning
- Case Management
- Skill Building
- Employment Assistance
- Housing Assistance
- Advocacy
- Information and Referral
- Transitional Planning

Discharge Criteria

- Achieve maximum stay of 18 months
- Young adult ages out (a young adult may enter at the maximum age of 24 and age out at 25 years and six months)
- Young adult successfull completes program goals
- Young adult voluntarily leaves program
- Young adult needs services beyond what the agency can provide
- Young adult is terminated from program for gross violation of rules
- Program loses contact with young adult; whereabouts unknown


