Clinical Services

Expanded Crisis Services (ECS)

ECS provides stabilizing supports following a Crisis Mobile Outreach (CMO) encounter that focuses on improving emotional and behavioral regulation and reducing risk to self and others by assisting with crisis planning; engaging in short-term therapeutic interventions; and providing case management to link with more long-term resources, such as Child & Adolescent Mental Health Division (CAMHD) services, or other outpatient community providers.

Intensive In-Home Services (IIHS) / Intensive Independent Living Skills (IILS)

IIHS and IILS provides comprehensive, behavioral, community-based services for children and families known to CAMHD State of Hawai'i, Department of Health. Services are based on an intensive, individualized, strengths-based approach that focuses on the youth and family's needs and goals.

Transitional Family Homes Program (TFH)

Hale Kipa provides therapeutic foster care services on the islands of Oʻahu and Hawaiʻi under our TFH Program, which is overseen by CAMHD State of Hawaiʻi, Department of Health. Youth ages 3 through 17 years of age are placed with trained resource caregivers (foster parents) for as little as a few days up to 11 months and provide regular ongoing support.

Residential Services

Emergency Shelters / Kamala Homes

Hale Kipa operates several types of shelters on O'ahu offering emergency services for youth through age 17. Our shelters are open to youth who have been abused, or are neglected, unsheltered, or facing a personal crisis.

Hale Hoʻopakele

Hale Hoʻopakele (home that rescues) on Oʻahu is open to youth, ages 12 through 17, who are victims / survivors of commercial sexual exploitation and sex trafficking.

Hāloa House

Hāloa House is a residential program overseen by a live-in Resident Advisor, that provides skill-building services to young women (ages 18 through 24) who were formerly in foster care or experienced being unsheltered to help them obtain education, employment, and safe living arrangements.

Independent Living Program Training Home (ILPTH)

ILPTH offers a home and skill-building services to youth or young men, ages 17 through 21, on parole or probation to help them obtain education, employment, and safe living arrangements.

TLP on O'ahu provides residential services to young adults ages 18 through 21 experiencing homelessness being unsheltered, to promote their successful transition to self-sufficiency.

Community-Based Outreach & Advocacy Programs (CBOA)

CBOA provide strategic outreach and linkages to build community relationships with youth and young adults ages 10 through 21 and their families. Educational support, skill building, advocacy and case management services are also provided.

Guide On The Side (GOTS)

Help young adults, ages 18 through 24, address the challenges of being unsheltered, navigate support systems and meet basic health, education, employment, and housing needs.

Ho'okala Attendant Care Program

Hoʻokala (to free or release) Attendant Care Program is a diversion program to ensure that juveniles are not secured inappropriately in police lock-ups. The program provides 24-hour accessibility to police for youth being released from their custody.

Independent Living Program, Higher Education, Imua Kākou ('IHI)

Hale Kipa provides support, skill building and connections for youth, ages 12 through 27, in or formerly in foster care. Also includes housing options for young adults.

Imua Kākou (moving forward together) is a voluntary program from the Hawaiʻi Department of Human Services that extends the services of foster care to young adults who turned 18 while in foster care. Services are offered until age 21. Hale Kipa provides case management services for this program on Oʻahu.

Ka'i Like Program works collaboratively with Family Court to provide opportunities and support to youth involved in the juvenile justice system.

KJAC provides a range of services including case management, family support, referrals, youth development and linkages to local cultural opportunities to youth given an eligible civil citation in Honolulu Police Department's District 5 (primarily Kalihi). The program seeks to divert youth from deeper connection to the court or justice systems.


